WHAT IS PAVEMENT PRESERVATION CERTIFICATION

Certification requirements are common in highway construction and have existed for asphalt, concrete, and soils since they were first endorsed by AASHTO in the late 1970's.

Pavement preservation certification was authorized by the AASHTO TSP·2 Oversight Panel in early 2016 and includes an examination administered to both agency and contractor personnel.

WHY CERTIFICATION?

The purpose of the pavement preservation certification is to achieve consistently high-quality preservation treatments by testing owner agency and contractor personnel on critical competencies in constructing preservation treatments.

With the implementation of performance measures through MAP-21 and the FAST Act, states are going to be held accountable for the condition of their road network. With this accountability comes tremendous opportunity to use pavement preservation treatments as the most cost-effective method to improve network conditions. By the same token, poor treatment performance may reduce or eliminate an agency's use of that treatment since the potential ramifications of missing network condition targets are substantial.
